Main objective	The main purpose of the survey is to measure household and individual incomes and income distribution

Instruments and main contents	IDS is a combination of interviews and administrative registers. In interviews both CAPI and CATI were used for persons over 15 years old.
<b>Definitions</b>	
Household	Persons who live in the same address, and who eat together or otherwise share their income
Household head	Person with the largest income
<b>Data quality aspects</b>	
Unit response rate	85.2%
Item non-response / imputation	There is no item-response for the incomes received from administrative registers. Hot-deck imputation has been used for missing interest income.
Weighting	The weight inflates to total population

Reference period	Calendar year 2004
Definition of employment	Everybody who has worked at least 6 months in the survey year
Treatment of military personel	Military personel and their families are included in the survey
