Resident boarders, lodgers, tenants, visitors, domestis servants and au-pairs are considered as household members only if they do not have a private address that they consider the own elsewhere and their actual or intended duration of stay is at least six months and they share expenses.
Household head	SILC survey does not use the notion of household head, instead there are two concepts used: the ideal household respondent who is considered to be the person responsible for the dwelling, and the household member responding to the household questionnaire, who may differ from the ideal one respondent. Note: LIS uses the ideal household respondent as a household head.
