Definitions	
Household	So called housekeeping unit is a group of individuals who live together in the same dwelling, prepare and have meals together, and who share the housekeeping.
Household head	A housekeeping unit can contain one or several family units. If there is only one family unit, the reference person is the person who has the highest earnings including pensions; if there is more than one family unit the reference person of the housekeeping unit is the reference person from the "dominated" family unit (family unit with children or cohabiting).

Weighting	Two weights are provided, one for the total sample, and one recalibrated to the subsample of the interviewed households. Both weights inflates to total population.
