






































































Relative risk profiles compared






















Ageing and family sizes








Ageing and family sizes + Non nationals









Target 1.2

Cut poverty rates by half according to national standards?

No... not with our *relative* standards

a "good sign" - median incomes grow

... but an inequality issue - low incomes grow but not as fast as the median
